Sunday of the Word of God

The Lord (the Word) always surprises us – just ask the prophet Isaiah, St. Paul, and St. Peter in today's Word of the Lord! All that the Lord asks of us is an open mind and a simple heart - an open mind to hear and receive His Word, and an open heart to love others as He loves us.

As He did with Isaiah, Paul and Peter, Jesus speaks to us in the daily reality of our lives — be we fishing, walking or working. He speaks to us in the reality of our lives — in our families (their struggles and joys); in those in need (those who hunger and thirst); in the stranger or new neighbour to whom we are invited to extend a word of welcome — He speaks to us, all our encounters being opportunities for us to hear and welcome the Lord who always surprises us.

The Lord can also surprise us by inviting us to change the way we do some of things we have grown accustomed to, inviting us to do them in a new way - like Jesus asking Peter to throw out his nets at a different time of day and surprising him with the abundance of his catch!

So often we can all close ourselves off from the invitation to change and in so doing to miss the opportunity encountering the Lord who comes to surprise us, comes knocking on the door of our lives (our reality) inviting us to welcome something new into our lives – be it a new priest, a new way of being parish, whatever!

Like with Isaiah, St. Paul and St. Peter in today's Word of the Lord, may our ears be opened to hear the Lord's invitation and our hearts be ready to respond: Here I am Lord send me!

23/12/2021COVID-19 Implications for the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne



Face coverings will be required for gatherings indoors for people aged eight and over.

A reminder this will mean:

The Reader: may lower his/her face covering for the readings. This applies as well for the Universal Prayer.

Cantors and Singers: when a cantor is singing, the face covering may be lowered. It must be worn at all other times. Distancing between singers is recommended.

Communicants: Each communicant comes forward and removes one side of their face covering and sanitises their hands at a sanitation station provided nearby. Following reception of the Blessed Sacrament they step to the side to place the host on their tongue. The communicant replaces their face covering and returns to their seat

QR Check-In: QR code check in is required for all Places of Worship. For those who do not have a device, provision must be made to assist with a check in or to capture name and contact details.

Vaccinations: no current vaccination requirements.

He is like a tree by the waterside that thrusts its roots to the stream: when the heat comes it feels no alarm, its foliage stays green; it has no worries in a year of drought, and never ceases to bear fruit.'
