Dear friends.

As Kermit the Frog once said, "It's not easy being green!"

After six weeks of Lent, the celebration of the sacred Triduum, the overflowing joy of Easter for seven weeks, culminating in Pentecost followed by the celebrations of Trinity Sunday, and Corpus Christi, we come at last to a Sunday in so called "Ordinary Time". We come to that time of green vestments and green altar cloths after the whites of Easter and before the violet of Advent.

What does this mean for us? Ordinary Time can seem like the forty-year wanderings of the Israelites in the desert, towards a Promised Land of the next solemnity or a new liturgical season. As Catholics, we all look forward to these great seasons and celebrations of our liturgical year, for they are reminders for us of the history of our salvation. And it is important that we do remember them, and make these events present in our lives once again.

But we walk a fine line. There is a danger that we look for God only in the peak moments of our liturgical year, and cease to seek out the presence of God in Ordinary Time. Our celebration of Ordinary Time should be anything but "Ordinary". As St John Paul II reminds us in his Apostolic Letter Dies Domini, Sunday is our weekly Easter, our weekly celebration of God the Father who raised Jesus Christ from the dead. So, our Sunday celebration of Mass, our weekly nourishment at the table of the Word, and the table of the Eucharist should take a pride of place in our lives, and should take this time - allegedly ordinary - to new depths of encounter with the Risen Jesus.

It is in ordinary everyday things that we are called not only to find the presence of God for ourselves, but to help others see that same presence of God. So let us enjoy this time called "Ordinary". And let us look - with renewed vigour - for God in the ordinary, everyday moments of our lives.

READINGS FOR THE 14TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

This week we have the readings for next Sunday the 3^{rd} of July for Parishioners to make some time during the week to read and reflect on.

FIRST READING | Isaiah 66:10-14

Rejoice, Jerusalem, be glad for her, all you who love her! Rejoice, rejoice for her, all you who mourned her!

That you may be suckled, filled, from her consoling breast, that you may savour with delight her glorious breasts.

For thus says the Lord:

Now towards her I send flowing peace, like a river, and like a stream in spate the glory of the nations.

At her breast will her nurslings be carried and fondled in her lap.

Like a son comforted by his mother will I comfort you. And by Jerusalem you will be comforted.

At the sight your heart will rejoice, and your bones flourish like the grass. To his servants the Lord will reveal his hand.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM

R. Let all the earth cry out to God with joy.

Cry out with joy to God all the earth, O sing to the glory of his name. O render him glorious praise. Say to God: 'How tremendous your deeds! (R.)

'Before you all the earth shall bow; shall sing to you, sing to your name!' Come and see the works of God, tremendous his deeds among men. (R.)

He turned the sea into dry land, they passed through the river dry-shod. Let our joy then be in him; he rules for ever by his might. (R.)

Come and hear, all who fear God. I will tell what he did for my soul: Blessed be God who did not reject my prayer nor withhold his love from me. (R.)

SECOND READING | Galatians 6:14-18

The only thing I can boast about is the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom the world is crucified to me, and I to the world. It does not matter if a person is circumcised or not: what matters is for him to become an altogether new creature. Peace and mercy to all who follow this rule, who form the Israel of God. I want no more trouble from anybody after this; the

marks on my body are those of Jesus. The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit, my brothers. Amen.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Alleluia, alleluia! May the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, and the fullness of his message live within you. Alleluia!

GOSPEL | Luke 10:1-12,17-20

The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them out ahead of him, in pairs, to all the towns and places he himself was to visit. He said to them, 'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest. Start off now, but remember, I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. Carry no purse, no haversack, no sandals. Salute no one on the road.

'Whatever house you go into, let your first words be, "Peace to this house!" And if a man of peace lives there, your peace will go and rest on him; if not, it will come back to you. Stay in the same house, taking what food and drink they have to offer, for the labourer deserves his wages; do not move from house to house.

'Whenever you go into a town where they make you welcome, eat what is set before you. Cure those in it who are sick, and say, "The kingdom of God is very near to you." But whenever you enter a town and they do not make you welcome, go out into its streets and say, "We wipe off the very dust of your town that clings to our feet, and leave it with you. Yet be sure of this: the kingdom of God is very near." I tell you, on that day it will not go as hard with Sodom as with that town.'

The seventy-two came back rejoicing. 'Lord,' they said 'even the devils submit to us when we use your name.' He said to them, 'I watched Satan fall like lightning from heaven. Yes, I have given you power to tread underfoot serpents and scorpions and the whole strength of the enemy; nothing shall ever hurt you. Yet do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you; rejoice rather that your names are written in heaven.'
