Dear friends.

All three of our readings this Sunday call us to *faith-filled vigilance*, a *focused* waiting, a *holy patience* if you like. Our *First Reading* from *the Book of Wisdom* urges us to work, to witness, and to worship in this world with our hearts set on the future that God has prepared for us.

To encourage such *perpetual watchfulness*, early monastic rules urged believers to rise during the night, or at least before dawn, to keep vigil, reading psalms and scripture in prayerful expectation of Jesus' return. This tradition continues in the daily cycle of prayer of monastic communities today. Those called to the contemplative life rise while the rest of us sleep in order that they might be free and focused to pray for the world. If you like, they're our *spiritual* first responders.

Like first responders, our watchfulness is to be not only prayerful but oriented towards *service*. This is the *active*contemplative balance so often proposed by Jesus in Luke's Gospel. In today's Gospel, using Luke's favourite image of sharing a meal, Jesus depicts the master *girding* himself, making himself ready for action, just as the disciples have been told to do. True discipleship, in Luke's Gospel, is not settling for the least we can get away with until our master's return, but *getting ready* by always *being ready* for his kingdom to come.

m th}$ of August for Parishioners to make some time during the week to read and reflect on.

FIRST READING | Jeremiah 38:4-6,8-10

The king's leading men spoke to the king. 'Let Jeremiah be put to death: he is unquestionably disheartening the remaining soldiers in the city, and all the people too, by talking like this. The fellow does not have the welfare of this people at heart so much as its ruin.' 'He is in your hands as you know,' King Zedekiah answered 'for the king is powerless against you.' So they took Jeremiah and threw him into the well of Prince Malchiah in the Court of the Guard, letting him down with ropes. There was no water in the well, only mud, and into the mud Jeremiah sank.

Ebed-melech came out from the palace and spoke to the king. 'My lord king,' he said 'these men have done a wicked thing by treating the prophet Jeremiah like this: they have thrown him into the well, where he will die.' At this the king gave Ebed-melech the Cushite the following order: 'Take three men with you from here and pull the prophet Jeremiah out of the well before he dies.'

SECOND READING | Hebrews 12:1-4

With so many witnesses in a great cloud on every side of us, we too, then, should throw off everything that hinders us, especially the sin that clings so easily, and keep running steadily in the race we have started. Let us not lose sight of Jesus, who leads us in our faith and brings it to perfection: for the sake of the joy which was still in the future, he endured the cross, disregarding the shamefulness of it, and from now on has taken his place at the right of God's throne. Think of the way he stood such opposition from sinners and then you will not give up for want of courage. In the fight against sin, you have not yet had to keep fighting to the point of death.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Alleluia, alleluia! My sheep listen to my voice, says the Lord; I know them, and they follow me. Alleluia!

GOSPEL | Luke 12:49-53

Jesus said to his disciples: 'I have come to bring fire to the earth, and how I wish it were blazing already! There is a baptism I must still receive, and how great is my distress till it is over!

'Do you suppose that I am here to bring peace on earth? No, I tell you, but rather division. For from now on a household of five will be divided: three against two and two against three; the father divided against the son, son against father, mother against daughter, daughter against mother, mother-in-law against daughter-in-law, daughter-in-law against mother-in-law.'
