Dear friends.

This Sunday, we begin our new Liturgical Year with the First Sunday of Advent. While Advent is very similar to Lent – purple vestments and no Gloria – it is also different to Lent largely because there is a *twofold* nature to Advent. Yes, Advent is a time of preparation for our celebration of the coming of Christ at Christmas. But it is also a time of preparation for the Second Coming of Christ at the end of time. A time during which we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. A time for us to stay *awake*, because we do not know the day or the hour when the Master is coming?

And, how ready are we? This Sunday's Gospel calls us to *stay awake* and *stand ready*. But what does that actually mean? Especially if, as Paul also tells us in the Second Reading to be ready because our salvation is now at hand. It is a case of *already* and the *not yet*. Are we like those people in the Gospel, where one is taken and the one standing next to him is spared? Or have we taken heed of Paul's exhortation to the Church of Rome: are we ready because we know that our salvation is now at hand? Are we ready, now that the night is almost over, it will be daylight soon?

This weekend's Readings at Mass 1st Sunday of Advent

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON

To you, I lift up my soul, O my God. In you, I have trusted; let me not be put to shame. Nor let my enemies exult over me; and let none who hope in you be put to shame.

FIRST READING | Isaiah 2:1-5

The vision of Isaiah son of Amoz, concerning Judah and Jerusalem. In the days to come the mountain of the Temple of the Lord shall tower above the mountains and be lifted higher than the hills. All the nations will stream to it, peoples without number will come to it; and they will say:

'Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the Temple of the God of Jacob that he may teach us his ways so that we may walk in his paths; since the Law will go out from Zion, and the oracle of the Lord from Jerusalem.'

He will wield authority over the nations and adjudicate between many peoples; these will hammer their swords into ploughshares, their spears into sickles. Nation will not lift sword against nation, there will be no more training for war.

O House of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the Lord.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM

R. Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord.

I rejoiced when I heard them say: 'Let us go to God's house.' And now our feet are standing within your gates, O Jerusalem. *R.*

It is there that the tribes go up, the tribes of the Lord. For Israel's law it is, there to praise the Lord's name. There were set the thrones of judgement of the house of David. *R.*

For the peace of Jerusalem pray: 'Peace be to your homes! May peace reign in your walls, in your palaces, peace!' *R*.

For love of my brethren and friends I say: 'Peace upon you!' For love of the house of the Lord I will ask for your good. *R.*

SECOND READING | Romans 13:11-14

You know 'the time' has come: you must wake up now: our salvation is even nearer than it was when we were converted. The night is almost over, it will be daylight soon – let us give up all the things we prefer to do under cover of the dark; let us arm ourselves and appear in the light. Let us live decently as people do in the daytime: no drunken orgies, no promiscuity or licentiousness, and no wrangling or jealousy. Let your armour be the Lord Jesus Christ.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Alleluia, alleluia! Lord, show us your mercy and love, and grant us your salvation. Alleluia!

GOSPEL | Matthew 24:37-44

Jesus said to his disciples: 'As it was in Noah's day, so will it be when the Son of Man comes. For in those days before the Flood people were eating, drinking, taking wives, taking husbands, right up to the day Noah went into the ark, and they suspected nothing till the Flood came and swept all away. It will be like this when the Son of Man comes. Then of two men in the fields one is taken, one left; of two women at the millstone grinding, one is taken, one left.

'So stay awake, because you do not know the day when your master is coming. You may be quite sure of this, that if the householder had known at what time of the night the burglar would come, he would have stayed awake and would not have allowed anyone to break through the wall of his house. Therefore, you too must stand ready because the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.'
