#### Dear friends.

In this Sunday's readings, both Jeremiah and Jesus call us to faithfulness to the Covenant. Jesus' words to us are strong: I have come to bring fire to the earth, and how I wish it were blazing already. Do you suppose I have come to bring peace on earth? No, I tell you, but rather division. The Covenant to which we are called is serious. It is not for the fainthearted.

So, if the Covenant is serious, then so too, is discipleship. When we decide to be faithful to the Covenant. It's not about everybody just being happy. It is not moving to the urgings of secular society. At times, faithfulness – and especially faithfulness to God - is about making tough decisions, unpopular decisions. Fidelity demands hard work and commitment from us. Often enough, it demands that walk a different path from others, from the world, even when it is unpopular to do so.

Neither Jeremiah nor Jesus settled for such a cop-out. Like Jeremiah, Jesus, too, was accused of misleading the people. Both Jeremiah and Jesus were brought before the authorities. Authorities who themselves were unable to stand up to the bullies who opposed Jesus and Jeremiah. And ultimately these authorities gave in. They hand both Jesus and Jeremiah over to their accusers. Jeremiah's innocence was recognised by a pagan, the Ethiopian palace servant; Jesus' innocence, too, was recognised by a pagan, a Roman centurion, as he hung upon the Cross. Jeremiah was eventually saved from death by the same Ethiopian. Jesus did die, we know, but was raised from the dead by the Father's love. Fidelity to the Covenant might result in death, but never dishonour. As the story of Jesus teaches us, fidelity ends in Resurrection.

### **ANNIVERSARIES & MASS OFFERINGS**

One of the customs of our Church is the practice of making an offering to a priest when you request that a Mass be offered for your intentions. When the intention is for a deceased loved one on an anniversary, this is often accompanied by praying for the deceased in the Prayers of the Faithful at Mass and a mention in the Anniversaries section of the Parish weekly bulletin.

Therefore, if you ask one of our priests to offer Mass for your loved ones who have died, the priest will say Mass for them, but we are only able to include in the Bulletin those whose actual anniversaries are actually occurring at the time.

If you wish to have Mass offered for other deceased relatives, that is certainly possible, but their names are not able to be mentioned in the bulletin and Prayers of the Faithful.

People often ask, "How much does a Mass cost?" The Church does not charge for the celebration of sacraments. For your information, I publish for you that on 8 March 2001, the Bishops of Victoria legislated that the offering to be made for the celebration of Mass normally is \$10.00.

Sometimes, people also request Masses to be offered on specific days. Please make sure you speak to the priests personally regarding the offering of Mass on specific days – a priest can only offer one Mass on one day, and so it is not always possible to offer Mass on a specific day. We will always seek to find a solution in the best interest of all concerned.

If you wish to have an anniversary mentioned in the Bulletin, please phone or email the Parish Office by 1.00pm on Thursday.

# READINGS FOR THE NEXT SUNDAY

#### 21<sup>ST</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Readings for next Sunday the 21st of August for Parishioners to make some time during the week to read and reflect on.

# FIRST READING | Isaiah 66:18-21

The Lord says this: I am coming to gather the nations of every language. They shall come to witness my glory. I will give them a sign and send some of their survivors to the nations: to Tarshish, Put, Lud, Moshech, Rosh, Tubal, and Javan, to the distant islands that have never heard of me or seen my glory. They will proclaim my glory to the nations. As an offering to the Lord they will bring all your brothers, on horses, in chariots, in litters, on mules, on dromedaries, from all the nations to my holy mountain in Jerusalem, says the Lord, like Israelites bringing oblations in clean vessels to the Temple of the Lord. And of some of them I will make priests and Levites, says the Lord.

### **RESPONSORIAL PSALM**

R. Go out to all the world, and tell the Good News.

O praise the Lord, all you nations, acclaim him all you peoples! (R.)

Strong is his love for us; he is faithful for ever. **(R.)** 

### **SECOND READING | Hebrews 12:5-7,11-13**

Have you forgotten that encouraging text in which you are addressed as sons? My son, when the Lord corrects you, do not treat it lightly; but do not get discouraged when he reprimands you. For the Lord trains the ones that he loves and he punishes all those that he acknowledges as his sons. Suffering is part of your training; God is treating you as his sons. Has there ever been any son whose father did not train him? Of course, any punishment is most painful at the time, and far from pleasant; but later, in those on whom it has been used, it bears fruit in peace and goodness. So hold up your limp arms and steady your trembling knees and smooth out the path you tread; then the injured limb will not be wrenched, it will grow strong again.

# **GOSPEL | Luke 13:22-30**

Through towns and villages Jesus went teaching, making his way to Jerusalem. Someone said to him, 'Sir, will there be only a few saved?' He said to them, 'Try your best to enter by the narrow door, because, I tell you, many will try to enter and will not succeed.

'Once the master of the house has got up and locked the door, you may find yourself knocking on the door, saying, "Lord, open to us" but he will answer, "I do not know where you come from." Then you will find yourself saying, "We once ate and drank in your company; you taught in our streets" but he will reply, "I do not know where you come from. Away from me, all you wicked men!" "Then there will be weeping and grinding of teeth, when you see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God, and yourselves turned outside. And men from east and west, from north and south, will come to take their places at the feast in the kingdom of God.
