Dear friends.

In this Sunday's readings, we hear from two country-born prophets, from the same part of the world. Amos, from Tekoa, calls the people to wholeness of life and to solidarity as one people under God. His message is plain: you cannot enjoy the protection of God while living off the misery of the poor. Religion and greed cannot worship in the same pew.

The point is made by the other country prophet. Jesus from Bethlehem has the same frankness in speech, the same preference for the poor, and the same message: You cannot be the slave both of God and of money. Jesus teaches us that people who cannot be trusted to deal with money, cannot be trusted with the genuine riches of the Kingdom of God. The danger is that they will begin to twist their religious beliefs around their wallets.

Amos and Jesus both voice God's concern by reminding us of social justice and personal responsibility. Our worship of God has to influence the way we behave. Our worship of God has to influence our way of dealing with each other. And how we treat others indicates our readiness for the Kingdom. It's all tied together. If money talks, it should speak with the language of the Kingdom.

A program that seeks to find 'the threads that bind us together', through music, culture, spirituality, Christianity and community.



# This weekend's Readings at Mass 25<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### **ENTRANCE ANTIPHON | Cf. Sir 36: 18**

I am the salvation of the people, says the Lord. Should they cry to me in any distress, I will hear them, and I will be their Lord for ever.

#### FIRST READING | Amos 8:4-7

Listen to this, you who trample on the needy and try to suppress the poor people of the country, you who say, 'When will New Moon be over so that we can sell our corn, and sabbath, so that we can market our wheat? Then by lowering the bushel, raising the shekel, by swindling and tampering with the scales, we can buy up the poor for money, and the needy for a pair of sandals, and get a price even for the sweepings of the wheat.' The Lord swears it by the pride of Jacob, 'Never will I forget a single thing you have done.'

#### **RESPONSORIAL PSALM**

#### R. Praise the Lord who lifts up the poor.

Praise, O servants of the Lord, praise the name of the Lord!
May the name of the Lord be blessed both now and for evermore! *R.* 

High above all nations is the Lord, above the heavens his glory.
Who is like the Lord, our God, who has risen on high to his throne yet stoops from the heights to look down, to look down upon heaven and earth?

From the dust he lifts up the lowly, from the dung-heap he raises the poor to set him in the company of princes, yes, with the princes of his people.

#### **SECOND READING | 1 Timothy 2:1-8**

My advice is that, first of all, there should be prayers offered for everyone – petitions, intercessions and thanksgiving – and especially for kings and others in authority, so that we may be able to live religious and reverent lives in peace and quiet. To do this is right, and will please God our saviour: he wants everyone to be saved and reach full knowledge of the truth. For there is only one God, and there is only one mediator between God and mankind, himself a man, Christ Jesus, who sacrificed himself as a ransom for them all. He is the evidence of this, sent at the appointed time, and I have been named a herald and apostle of it and – I am telling the truth and no lie – a teacher of the faith and the truth to the pagans.

In every place, then, I want the men to lift their hands up reverently in prayer, with no anger or argument.

#### **GOSPEL ACCLAMATION**

Alleluia, alleluia! Jesus Christ was rich but he became poor, to make you rich out of his poverty. Alleluia!

#### **GOSPEL** | Luke 16:1-13

Jesus said to his disciples:

There was a rich man and he had a steward denounced to him for being wasteful with his property. He called for the man and said, "What is this I hear about you? Draw me up an account of your stewardship because you are not to be my steward any longer." Then the steward said to himself, "Now that my master is taking the stewardship from me, what am I to do? Dig? I am not strong enough. Go begging? I should be too ashamed. Ah, I know what I will do to make sure that when I am dismissed from office there will be some to welcome me into their homes."

Then he called his master's debtors one by one. To the first he said, "How much do you owe my master?" "One hundred measures of oil" was the reply. The steward said, "Here, take your bond; sit down straight away and write fifty." To another he said, "And you, sir, how much do you owe?" "One hundred measures of wheat" was the reply. The steward said, "Here, take your bond and write eighty."

'The master praised the dishonest steward for his astuteness. For the children of this world are more astute in dealing with their own kind than are the children of light. 'And so I tell you this: use money, tainted as it is, to win you friends, and thus make sure that when it fails you, they will welcome you into the tents of eternity. The man who can be trusted in little things can be trusted in great; the man who is dishonest in little things will be dishonest in great. If then you cannot be trusted with money, that tainted thing, who will trust you with genuine riches? And if you cannot be trusted with what is not yours, who will give you what is your very own?

'No servant can be the slave of two masters: he will either hate the first and love the second, or treat the first with respect and the second with scorn. You cannot be the slave both of God and of money.'
