Dear friends,

This Sunday, our Second Readings start coming from the Second Letter to Timothy. 1 Timothy is what scholars call one of the Pastoral Epistles. Not written to any churches, but rather to the pastors of these churches. And while these Pastoral Epistles were addressed to Timothy and Titus, their message is not for their eyes and ears alone. These epistles would have read out to the local church assembly so as to be of benefit to the whole congregation. Paul, in today's Second Reading, is encouraging Timothy not to lose heart in the face of opposition and trial. Just as Paul encourages the young bishop Timothy, so too, as we listen to today's Second Reading, should we find encouragement and challenge. We carry with us the power of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. So, we should never be afraid of witnessing to the Lord, or ashamed of belonging to him. For to be timid is to think we have to do this on our own. Nothing could be further from the truth. The power of the resurrection of Jesus which we have been trusted to look after and carry within us is indeed something precious. We guard it with the help of the Holy Spirit who lives in us.

This weekend's Readings at Mass 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON | Cf. Est 4: 17

Within your will, O Lord, all things are established, and there is none that can resist your will.

For you have made all things, the heaven and the earth, and all that is held within the circle of heaven; you are the Lord of all.

FIRST READING | Habakkuk 1:2-3,2:2-4

How long, O Lord, am I to cry for help while you will not listen; to cry 'Oppression!' in your ear and you will not save? Why do you set injustice before me, why do you look on where there is tyranny? Outrage and violence, this is all I see, all is contention, and discord flourishes. Then the Lord answered and said, 'Write the vision down, inscribe it on tablets to be easily read, since this vision is for its own time only: eager for its own fulfilment, it does not deceive; if it comes slowly, wait, for come it will, without fail. See how he flags, he whose soul is not at rights, but the upright man will live by his faithfulness.'

'Which of you, with a servant ploughing or minding sheep, would say to him when he returned from the fields, "Come and have your meal immediately"? Would he not be more likely to say, "Get my supper laid; make yourself tidy and wait on me while I eat and drink. You can eat and drink yourself afterwards"? Must he be grateful to the servant for doing what he was told? So with you: when you have done all you have been told to do, say, "We are merely servants: we have done no more than our duty."
