Dear friends,

Our celebration of the season of Advent always has a two-fold character. Yes, we are preparing to celebrate the great feast of the Birth of Christ at Christmas. But the coming of Christ at Christmas will be the focus of the *last* week of Advent. Last week, on the First Sunday of Advent, we were largely concerned with the coming of Christ at the end of all time. These middle two weeks focus on John the Baptist.

And so, we actually find ourselves, if you like, caught up in one great Advent. One great time of waiting *between* the first coming of Christ at Bethlehem and the Second Coming of Christ at the end of all time.

As our guide for these *in-between* times, the Church places before us the ^Pigure of John the Baptist. John, the great Forerunner of the Messiah, truly belongs to these *in-between* times. He stands as the last of the great prophets of the coming of the Lord.

The people who saw and heard the preaching of John the Baptist in the wilderness of Judaea would have seen in him something of the figure of the great prophet Elijah. But as much as he is a figure from the pages of the Old Testament, John the Baptist is very much a figure from the pages of the New Testament, too. John always points to the dawning of the era of the New Covenant. John always points to the one who follows him; the one whose sandals he is not fit even to carry. John the Baptist always has one foot in the Old Testament and one foot in the New.

As we follow the Lord during these *in-between* times, we are called to be known not by any name that we bear, but by the fruit we produce. The sweet, rich and juicy fruit of repentance, which grows not in the wilderness of sin, but in the fresh lush garden of fidelity and love.



This weekend's Readings at Mass 2nd Sunday of Advent

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON

O people of Sion, behold, the Lord will come to save the nations, and the Lord will make the glory of his voice heard in the joy of your heart.

FIRST READING | Isaiah 11:1-10

A shoot springs from the stock of Jesse, a scion thrusts from his roots: on him the spirit of the Lord rests, a spirit of wisdom and insight, a spirit of counsel and power, a spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the Lord. (The fear of the Lord is his breath.) He does not judge by appearances, he gives no verdict on hearsay, but judges the wretched with integrity, and with equity gives a verdict for the poor of the land. His word is a rod that strikes the ruthless, his sentences bring death to the wicked. Integrity is the loincloth round his waist, faithfulness the belt about his hips.

The wolf lives with the lamb, the panther lies down with the kid, calf and lion feed together, with a little boy to lead them. The cow and the bear make friends, their young lie down together. The lion eats straw like the ox. The infant plays over the cobra's hole; into the viper's lair the young child puts his hand. They do no hurt, no harm, on all my holy mountain, for the country is filled with the knowledge of the Lord as the waters swell the sea. That day, the root of Jesse shall stand as a signal to the peoples. It will be sought out by the nations and its home will be glorious.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM

R. Justice shall flourish in his time, and fullness of peace for ever.

O God, give your judgement to the king, to a king's son your justice, that he may judge your people in justice and your poor in right judgement. R.

In his days justice shall flourish and peace till the moon fails. He shall rule from sea to sea, from the Great River to earth's bounds.

For he shall save the poor when they cry and the needy who are helpless. He will have pity on the weak and save the lives of the poor.

May his name be blessed for ever and endure like the sun. Every tribe shall be blessed in him, all nations bless his name. R.

SECOND READING | Romans 15:4-9

Everything that was written long ago in the scriptures was meant to teach us something about hope from the

examples scripture gives of how people who did not give up were helped by God. And may he who helps us when we refuse to give up, help you all to be tolerant with each other, following the example of Christ Jesus, so that united in mind and voice you may give glory to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

It can only be to God's glory, then, for you to treat each other in the same friendly way as Christ treated you. The reason Christ became the servant of circumcised Jews was not only so that God could faithfully carry out the promises made to the patriarchs, it was also to get the pagans to give glory to God for his mercy, as scripture says in one place: For this I shall praise you among the pagans and sing to your name.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Alleluia, alleluia!

Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths: all people shall see the salvation of God. Alleluia!

GOSPEL | Luke 23:35-43

In due course John the Baptist appeared; he preached in the wilderness of Judaea and this was his message: 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand.' This was the man the prophet Isaiah spoke of when he said: *A voice cries in the wilderness:*

Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight.

This man John wore a garment made of camel-hair with a leather belt round his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. Then Jerusalem and all Judaea and the whole Jordan district made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. But when he saw a number of Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism he said to them, 'Brood of vipers, who warned you to fly from the retribution that is coming? But if you are repentant, produce the appropriate fruit, and do not presume to tell yourselves, "We have Abraham for our father," because, I tell you, God can raise children for Abraham from these stones. Even now the axe is laid to the roots of the trees, so that any tree which fails to produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown on the fire. I baptise you in water for repentance, but the one who follows me is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to carry his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand; he will clear his threshing-floor and gather his wheat into the barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.'
