Dear friends.

In today's First Reading, the author is the prophet of the coming Day of the Lord. It is the day when all things are consummated. Time ends. Life as we know it ends. And something new begins. But as Malachi assures us: but for you who fear my name, the sun of righteousness will shine out with healing in its rays. So, frightening as this Day of the Lord might be, we have no need to fear.

In today's Gospel Reading, Jesus gives us a similar assurance. This week, the focus is on the end of all things. And in great apocalyptic language full of battles and dispute and trial, Jesus recounts what the belief at that time was about the end of this world and the life of the world to come. And again, as he has so often in the course of the Gospels, Jesus tells us not to be afraid. Not to be concerned about what we will say or how we will defend ourselves. For Christ himself will come to defend us. We will be hated by all on account of the fact that we carry the name Christian. But still we are not to be afraid. Because not a hair of our head will be lost.

So when Jesus preaches about the end of the world in visions that are disturbing and violent, when we are afraid about just how our world might come to its end, Jesus calls to us gently and tenderly, be not afraid. For in one sense, in fact, in every sense, it does not matter what the consummation of all things will be like. Because at that moment, we will be taken into God's love and there will we abide.

What Happens to These Offerings?





This weekend's Readings at Mass 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON

SECOND READING | 2 Thessalonians 3:7-12

You know how you are supposed to imitate us: now we were not idle when we were with you, nor did we ever have our meals at anyone's table without paying for them; no, we worked night and day, slaving and straining, so as not to be a burden on any of you. This was not because we had no right to be, but in order to make ourselves an example for you to follow.

We gave you a rule when we were with you: do not let anyone have any food if he refuses to do any work. Now we hear that there are some of you who are living in idleness, doing no work themselves but interfering with everyone else's. In the Lord Jesus Christ, we order and call on people of this kind to go on quietly working and earning the food that they eat.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Alleluia, alleluia! Lift up your heads and see; your redemption is near at hand. Alleluia!

GOSPEL | Luke 21:5-19

When some were talking about the Temple, remarking how it was adorned with fine stonework and votive offerings, Jesus said, 'All these things you are staring at now – the time will come when not a single stone will be left on another: everything will be destroyed.' And they put to him this question: 'Master,' they said 'when will this happen, then, and what sign will there be that this is about to take place?'

'Take care not to be deceived,' he said 'because many will come using my name and saying, "I am he" and, "The time is near at hand." Refuse to join them. And when you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened, for this is something that must happen but the end is not so soon.' Then he said to them, 'Nation will fight against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes and plagues and famines here and there; there will be fearful sights and great signs from heaven. 'But before all this happens, men will seize you and persecute you; they will hand you over to the synagogues and to imprisonment, and bring you before kings and governors because of my name – and that will be your opportunity to bear witness. Keep this carefully in mind: you are not to prepare your defence, because I myself shall give you an eloquence and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to resist or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, relations and friends; and some of you will be put to death. You will be hated by all men on account of my name, but not a hair of your head will be lost. Your endurance will win you your lives.'
