### Dear friends.

Like last Sunday's readings, today's readings talk about what it is to be called to be a prophet. What it is to be sent by God as a messenger to others; to proclaim God's message of salvation.

In today's First Reading, we hear about the prophet Amos. Amos comes from that time in Israel's history, when the ten tribes of Israel in the North broke away from the two tribes of Judah in the South. It is fair to say that the nation was in a bit of turmoil. And into all of this comes the prophet Amos. Amos was from the Southern Kingdom of Judah, yet he was not afraid to go to the Northern Kingdom of Israel and preach the Word of God at Bethel, the religious capital of the Northern Kingdom.

Not surprisingly, Amaziah, the priest at Bethel, is none too thrilled at Amos turning up on his doorstep. Amaziah tells Amos quite plainly, we do not want you here. Do your prophesying elsewhere. And then Amos explains himself. Look, says Amos, I was no prophet...I did not belong to any of the brotherhoods of prophets...I was a shepherd...I looked after sycamores...It was the Lord who took me from herding sheep, and the Lord who said, "Go, prophesy to my people Israel." Amos is not chosen because he is the best prepared to preach God's Word. Because the prophet does not preach the Word of God only in the words he speaks. The prophet is called to proclaim God's message with his whole life. The prophet is called to be a sign of the steadfast and faithful love of God. In the midst of his ordinary life, God called Amos to do and be something very different.

Just as Amos was happy tending his sheep, so, I suspect, were the Twelve Apostles more or less happy as fisherman and in the other jobs which they had. But they are chosen by Jesus. Again, not because they are the best prepared or the most eloquent or the best preachers. Hardly. They are chosen because they are the ones who can best proclaim the faithful love of God with their whole lives, not just with any words they might preach.

Just as Amos was called, just as the Twelve were called, so too, each and every one of us is called to be prophets. Called to proclaim with what we say and what we do the steadfast and faithful love of God. And this, I think, is perhaps what most of us struggle with. Why would God choose us? Why does God choose us who by and large are not the best prepared to proclaim his message?

The answer is simple, if confounding.

It is the free gift of God which we call grace. As St Paul reminded the Church of Ephesus in today's Second Reading: *Before the* world was made, he chose us, chose us in Christ, to be holy and spotless, and to live through love in his presence....such is the richness of the grace...which he has showered on us....we were claimed as God's own, chosen from the beginning....chosen to be, for his greater glory...the people who would put their hopes in Christ.

Before all eternity, we are called by the love of God into a life. A life meant for the great glory of God.

## **Readings at Mass** The Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B — 14th July 2024

#### **First Reading: Amos 7:12-15** A reading from the prophet Amos

#### Go, prophesy to my people.

Amaziah, the priest of Bethel, said to Amos, 'Go away, seer; get back to the land of Judah; earn your bread there, do your prophesying there. We want no more prophesying in Bethel; this is the royal sanctuary, the national temple.' 'I was no prophet, neither did I belong to any of the brotherhoods of prophets.' Amos replied to Amaziah, 'I was a shepherd, and looked after sycamores: but it was the Lord who took me from herding the flock, and the Lord who said, "Go, prophesy to my people Israel."'

#### **Responsorial Psalm: Ps 84:9-14**

**R.** Lord, show us your mercy and love, and grant us your salvation.

I will hear what the Lord God has to say, a voice that speaks of peace, peace for his people. His help is near for those who fear him and his glory will dwell in our land. **R**.

Mercy and faithfulness have met; justice and peace have embraced. Faithfulness shall spring from the earth and justice look down from heaven. **R**.

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Ephesians

#### Before the world was made, he chose us in Christ.

Blessed be God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with all the spiritual blessings of heaven in Christ.

Before the world was made, he chose us, chose us in Christ, to be holy and spotless,

and to live through love in his presence,

- determined that we should become his adopted sons, through Jesus Christ
- for his own kind purposes,

to make us praise the glory of his grace,

his free gift to us in the Beloved

in whom, through his blood, we gain our freedom,

the forgiveness of our sins.

Such is the richness of the grace

which he has showered on us

in all wisdom and insight.

He has let us know the mystery of his purpose,

the hidden plan he so kindly made in Christ from the beginning to act upon when the times had run their course to the end: that he would bring everything together under Christ, as head, everything in the heavens and everything on earth. And it is in him that we were claimed as God's own, chosen from the beginning, under the predetermined plan of the one who guides all things as he decides by his own will; chosen to be, for his greater glory. the people who would put their hopes in Christ before he came. Now you too, in him, have heard the message of the truth and the good news of your salvation, and have believed it: and you have been stamped with the seal of the Holy Spirit of the Promise, the pledge of our inheritance which brings freedom for those whom God has taken for his own,

#### Gospel: Mark 6:7-13

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

He called the Twelve, and began to send them out.

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out in pairs giving them authority over the unclean spirits. And he instructed them to take nothing for the journey except a staff no bread, no haversack, no coppers for their purses. They were to wear sandals, but, he added, 'Do not take a spare tunic.' And he said to them, 'If you enter a house anywhere, stay there until you leave the district. And if any place does not welcome you and people refuse to listen to you, as you walk away shake off the dust from under your feet as a sign to them.' So they set off to preach repentance; and they cast out many devils, and anointed many sick people with oil and cured them.
